All during the week of July 19 to 23, the children and youth (and adults) of Emmanuel UCC and New Hope UMC got "fired up about Jesus" at Vacation Bible School. We gathered at Faith UMC for a sizzling Fiesta, celebrating Jesus and his roles in our lives.

We learned that Jesus is our friend on our first day. The lesson was the story

"We are fired up about Jesus!" of the four men who lowered their paralyzed friend through the roof of the house where Jesus was teaching so that He would heal him. Our Bible verse was "Now, you are my friends" (John 15:15). On the second day, we learned that Jesus is our life thorough the story of Lazarus being raised from the dead and our Bible verse was "And you must love the Lord your God with all your heart" (Deuteronomy 6:5). The Bible verse on day three was "Jesus called out to them,

'Come, follow me^{III} (Matthew 4:19), and our lesson taught us that Jesus is our leader as he chose his first disciples. "Since I live, you also will live" (John 14:19) was the inspirational verse on the fourth day which reminded us that through His death on the cross and Resurrection, Jesus is our Savior. The last Bible point we learned was that Jesus is our helper. This was demonstrated through the story of Jesus instructing Ananias to help Saul regain his sight after his vision of Jesus on the road to Damascus. We believe that "The Lord is my helper, so I will have no fear" (Hebrews 13:6).

Our evenings were filled with songs, games, food and crafts which reinforced the lessons for each day. It was an exciting time with lots of enthusiasm from everyone who attended, from the youngest child (approximately 3 years old) to the oldest adult (perhaps 60?). We all had an amazing time and hope that if you didn't join us this year, you will come when we do it all again next year.

This year's VBS Mission Project will benefit the Janet Weiss Children's Hospital of Geisinger Medical Center. We are asking for donations to purchase DVD's and Play Station 2 games for the hospitalized children to help pass the time.
