# YOUTH ACTIVITIES

#### **SOUP-ER-BOWL SUNDAY**

On February 3, which is the Super Bowl, and also on February 10, there are football shaped offering plates on the table next to the Fellowship Hall doorway and in the bell tower. Your donations will be used as a learning experience during the 30-Hour Famine to show our youth that many people need to shop on a tight budget. The food purchased will be used to restock the Food Bank and help feed the hungry in our area. This event was started with a simple prayer offered by some youth as they gathered for a Super Bowl party: "Lord as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those without a bowl of soup to eat." That prayer inspired a nationwide movement, the Souper Bowl of Caring, in which tens of thousands of young people across the country participate each year. Thank you in advance for your support of our youth as they participate in this countrywide mission.

#### FAMILY GAME NIGHT/POTLUCK AND SLEEPOVER February 8 and 9

Bring your appetites and games for an evening of fun and food on February 8. Beginning at 6:00 pm, we will have our potluck dinner. After that, we will play a variety of games including word games, Bible games, po-ke-no, plus whatever games you would like to bring. There will be a sleepover for the Youth Group members after the games are all played out. Youth Group members are reminded that the will need a permission slip in order to sleep over.

## March 14 and 15 be seen, be heard BE HUNGRY

This year, our youth will participate in the 30-Hour Famine beginning on March 14. Youth who want to participate can see Marc Davis for a pledge folder. Each youth has been instructed that they are not to eat after finishing their breakfast on Friday, March 14. The idea is that their friends will see them not eating lunch and ask why. This will be a way for our youth to make others aware of world hunger and the part youth can play in combating it. The 30-Hour Famine started 16 years ago as a way for junior high, high school and college-age students to help save – and change – children's lives. By going without food for 30 hours and raising money to help needy children, young people gain a deeper awareness of the needs in our world and realize they can play a vital role in making a difference. The youth go without food but can drink plenty of water and juices so they experience true hunger and learn powerful lessons of compassion for those who live with hunger daily. We will gather in the Fellowship Hall at 6:00 pm on Friday evening. During Friday evening and Saturday morning we will play games, read Scripture, have devotions and learn about the difficulties children around the world face just trying to survive. We will also take our shopping trip during this time to purchase items for the food bank with your donations from Souper Bowl Sunday. (Think about shopping when you are hungry - how many impulse items do you add to the cart?) The youth will end their fast with lunch on Saturday at 1:00 pm and parents may pick up their children at 2:00 pm.
