From The Pastor's Desk

This article was sent by our Conference Minister, Alan Miller. I thought it asked a couple of good and thought provoking questions and want to share it with you here.

A Rabbi was traveling at night to a meeting. Driving on country roads in an area unfamiliar to him, he made a wrong turn onto the access road to a military base. As he approached the guard house an armed sentry called out: "Who are you? What are you doing here?" The Rabbi yelled back: "Excuse me?" Again the guard yelled: "Who are you? What are you doing here?" This time the Rabbi asked; "Soldier, how much are you paid for stopping people and asking them these questions?" The soldier thought for a minute, did the calculations in his head, and told the Rabbi the amount of his weekly pay. To which the Rabbi said; "I will pay you even more if you will ask me those questions at the beginning of each new day!"

Who are you? What are you doing here? Most of us spend more of our day talking than listening. As a matter of fact, most of us are so good at talking that we give "the answers" to others before they even ask the questions. We give answers to others even if they don't have questions. It's like we are all playing Jeopardy, we know all the answers, now we just have to figure out the questions.

How would your day... maybe even your life... change if you began each day asking God the Rabbi's questions: Who am I? and Why am I here? and then sitting in silence listening to God?

And now from me – during this Easter time, a time of new life, a little reflection on these two questions would be in order. Why do you do what you do? Is it because it's what the world says is the right thing or is it because you have asked God and then listened for answers? I am available for Spiritual Direction – a time of reflection and prayer and asking questions – for anyone who would like to call me.

Read these words from a familiar hymn

"Take my life and let it be consecrated, Lord to thee.

Take my moments and my days – let them flow in ceaseless praise."

They hymn goes on to say, take my hands, take my voice, take my silver and gold, and take my will. We must dedicate time each day to sit and have conversation with God. God will take these things and use them but first we must be willing to ask *Who am I? and Why am I here?* And after you have the answers – act on them!

Turkey Supper Dates

April 15 to 17, 2010

Our Spring Supper this year will be our Turkey Supper. Please promote this dinner as much as possible since it is one of our biggest fundraisers. Posters are on the tables in the Narthex and next to the Fellowship Hall doorway. Please take a couple and pin them up around our community.

Please remember that it is <u>not necessary</u> to be at <u>the supper "forever"</u>. If everyone takes a turn, we can all help each other and feel good about volunteering to support our church. Sign-up sheets are on the tables in the Narthex and next to the Fellowship Hall Door.

As always, we need people to cook the turkeys. Don Eroh is the person to see if you can volunteer your time for this important item (what's a Turkey Supper without turkey, right?) *Please save the juice for gravy*. The turkeys arrive either at your home or at the church (depending on how you arrange it with Don) on Thursday morning.

On **Thursday evening at 6:00 p.m.,** walls are taken down and tables are set up. Then there is the cleaning and cutting up of the vegetables for the pickled cabbage and "eyeing" and cutting up of the potatoes for the stuffing.

Early **Friday morning at 7:00 a.m.** more potatoes are eyed (we need mashed potatoes, too) and then at about **8:00 a.m.** we start making the pickled cabbage and stuffing.

Saturday morning at 8:00 a.m. we start cleaning the meat off the turkeys, which is easier to do if the turkeys are warm. Those of you who clean your own turkeys and then deliver them really help to speed up this process. Then, of course, the actual event begins at 3:00 and goes to about 7:00 p.m. We can always use lots of hands for serving food, working in the kitchen, busing tables, and waiting on tables. By the end of the supper, the workers, many of whom have been there since 2:30 p.m. (mashing potatoes, making gravy, making sure the vegetables and stuffing are hot so that everything is ready at 3:00 p.m.) are ready for a rest. That's when it's nice to have a clean-up crew come in at 7:00 p.m. The tables all have to be cleaned off, tablecloths and chairs wiped down, Sunday School rooms put back into order and the walls put back up. The large roasters and cook pots are washed and put away until the next supper. The kitchen cleaned and floors washed and vacuumed.

As you can see, there is a lot of work involved in having a supper, but it is a lot of fun and fellowship, too. Please consider where you can be of service and join us.
