## From The Pastor's Desk

I just came from a prayer meeting with four other ministers. We meet together every other Wed. at one of our churches. Today it happened to be here. We talk about what is going on in our respective churches and lives and then go into prayer together and lift up all kinds of things. We all feel very cared for by each other.

Two of the pastors at the meeting today were from churches that tithe and have a difficult time understanding churches that do not have the tithing ethic. In their churches they do not need to have a stewardship campaign because people naturally give 10% of their income and then when anything else is needed they give over and above. Those of us who do tithe but are in churches that have not grown up tithing also have a difficult time understanding why people don't know how much they are blessed when they give to God from the heart – maybe even having to give up something else to support God's work in their lives, churches, and communities.

For the last two years Emmanuel has conducted a stewardship campaign. We have come up with ideas trying to encourage people to be more generous with the gifts they have been given by God. Nothing seems to have worked. Now, we are at a loss. Nobody wants to hear sermons on money all the time and preachers don't want to preach sermons on money all the time and they really shouldn't need to.

One of the pastors said "People just don't realize what a privilege it is to give a tithe. They miss out on so many blessings when they don't give back to God. If they would just try it for a while they would see the results in their lives and in the life of the church." How true that is. How wonderful it would be not to have to always be looking at the bottom line and wonder how we are going to pay our bills next month.

We wouldn't always be having to have suppers, and sub sales, and silent auctions, and flea markets. We would continue to have these things just because we enjoy the fellowship with one another and it gives us "extra" funds to do more good things for God's people and God's world whether in our own backyard or around the world. We could send people on mission trips to be a blessing and to be blessed.

Read Malachi 3:8-10 "8" Will a man rob God? Yet you rob me.

"But you ask, 'How do we rob you?'

"In tithes and offerings. You are under a curse—the whole nation of you—because you are robbing me. <sup>10</sup>Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the LORD Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it."

Why do we often overlook Malachi when quoting scripture?

I hear many of you say we need more members. If the members we had were truly committed to the word and work of God we could support ourselves with the members we have and then I'm sure we would be blessed with more people with whom to share God's word and God's love.

This shouldn't come as a shock to anyone. Our giving is published in the bulletin most Sundays so it should be obvious that we are not being generous with our resources. I don't mean everyone. But you know who you are. Open you hearts to your church and to the work of God in your church. You don't have to wait until January to give more. We need it now.

Then, it's back on the road again as we trek back to Emmanuel where more refreshments will be waiting (if you can help with refreshments, please see Cindy Heller). The round trip is an 8-mile hike (or run for some of our more fit participants). You can support this event by sponsoring a walker or by placing your donation in the basket on the bulletin table in the Donating to the CROP Walk will help strengthen our local resources since a portion of the donations is returned to local organizations, in our case the Wapwallopen Crossroads Ministerium and the food bank it supplies. ## Turkey Supper Dates

October 14 to 16, 2010

Please remember that it is <u>not necessary to be at</u> the supper "forever". If everyone takes a turn, we can all help each other and feel good about volunteering to support our church. Sign-up sheets are on the tables in the Narthex and next to the Fellowship Hall Door.

Don Eroh is looking for people to sell tickets. He has plenty for everyone, so get them and sell, sell, sell. The fall Supper is usually our best fundraiser and is easy to promote. Why? Because people love to eat – especially good food!!

As always, we need people to cook the turkeys. Don Eroh is the person to see if you can volunteer your time for this important item (what's a Turkey Supper without turkey, right?) The turkeys arrive either at your home or at the church (depending on how you arrange it with Don) on Thursday morning.

On Thursday evening at 6:30 p.m., walls are taken down and tables are set up. Then there is the cleaning and cutting up of the vegetables for the pickled cabbage and "eyeing" and cutting up of the potatoes for the stuffing. (We only have to eye the potatoes, not peel them since we have a potato peeler. Yeah!!)

Early Friday morning at 7:00 a.m. more potatoes are eyed (we need mashed potatoes, too) and then at about 8:00 a.m. we start making the pickled cabbage and stuffing.

Saturday morning at 8:00 a.m. we start cleaning the meat off the turkeys, which is easier to do if the turkeys are warm. Those of you who clean your own turkeys and then deliver them really help to speed up this process. Then, of course, the actual event begins at 3:00 and goes to about 7:00 p.m. We can always use lots of hands for serving food, working in the kitchen, busing tables, and waiting on tables. By the end of the supper at 7:00 p.m., the workers, many of whom have been there since 2:30 p.m. (mashing potatoes, making gravy, making sure the vegetables and stuffing are hot so that everything is ready at 3:00 p.m.) are ready for a rest. That's when it's nice to have a clean-up crew come in. The tables all have to be cleaned off, tablecloths and chairs wiped down, Sunday School rooms put back into order and the walls put back up. The large roasters and cook pots are washed and put away until the next supper. The kitchen cleaned and floors washed and vacuumed.

As you can see, there is a lot of work involved in having a supper, but it is a lot of fun and fellowship, too. Please consider where you can be of service and join us.
