SHICKSHINNY FLOOD RELIEF

The Scout packs and troops of Emmanuel UCC are pairing up with our members to help with Disaster Aid. There has been horrendous devastation in our area and the Cub Scout Packs 433, Boy Scout Troop 434 and Girl Scout Troops 3340 and 33369 are coordinating our efforts to send relief to the borough of Shickshinny (yes, the whole borough). We are accepting donations of new or lightly used furniture and house wares, towels and blankets, cleaning supplies, and clothing. So we're asking you to look through your unused stuff and see what you might have laying around. Check out what is really hiding in the shed, besides the spiders. We are also collecting toiletry items and packages of new socks. Most of us assemble "care packages" at Christmastime for our Sunday School's mission project, the McKinney Clinic. We can use their list as a guide to realize how much the families lost, right down to their toothbrushes. The packages include: new white socks, toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, comb, razor, and hand lotion packed into a freezer bag. Also appreciated are gift cards from Walmart and K-Mart. We are also accepting "loose" items if you have extras and will distribute them individually. Our delivery date is October 8 and we would appreciate receiving your donations by October 6. We will need time to sort and pack everything to truck down to Shickshinny. Volunteers are needed to help with receiving times which are Tuesdays and Thursdays from 5:00 pm to 8:00 pm and Saturdays from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm. We will also need volunteers to help with distribution in Shickshinny on October 8. After a time of prayer, the walk begins at 1:00 pm. We will walk from Emmanuel to St. James Lutheran Church where we will enjoy a brief break and some refreshments. Then, back again to Emmanuel where more refreshments will be waiting. The round trip is an 8-mile hike (or run for some of our more fit participants). Turkey Supper Dates

October 13 to 15, 2011

Please remember that it is <u>not necessary to be at the supper "forever"</u>. If everyone takes a turn, we can all help each other and feel good about volunteering to support our church. Sign-up sheets are on the tables in the Narthex and next to the Fellowship Hall Door.

Don Eroh is looking for people to sell tickets. He has plenty for everyone, so get them and sell, sell, sell. The fall Supper is usually our best fundraiser and is easy to promote. Why? Because people love to eat – especially good food!!

As always, we need people to cook the turkeys. Don Eroh is the person to see if you can volunteer your time for this important item (what's a Turkey Supper without turkey, right?) The turkeys arrive either at your home or at the church (depending on how you arrange it with Don) on Thursday morning.

On Thursday evening at 6:30 p.m., walls are taken down and tables are set up. Then there is the cleaning and cutting up of the vegetables for the pickled cabbage and "eyeing" and cutting up of the potatoes for the stuffing. (We only have to eye the potatoes, not peel them since we have a potato peeler. Yeah!!)

Early Friday morning at 7:00 a.m. more potatoes are eyed (we need mashed potatoes, too) and then at about 8:00 a.m. we start making the pickled cabbage and stuffing.

Saturday morning at 8:00 a.m. we start cleaning the meat off the turkeys, which is easier to do if the turkeys are warm. Those of you who clean your own turkeys and then deliver them really help to speed up this process. Then, of course, the actual event begins at 3:00 and goes to about 7:00 p.m. We can always use lots of hands for serving food, working in the kitchen, busing tables, and waiting on tables. By the end of the supper at 7:00 p.m., the workers, many of whom have been there since 2:30 p.m. (mashing potatoes, making gravy, making sure the vegetables and stuffing are hot so that everything is ready at 3:00 p.m.) are ready for a rest. That's when it's nice to have a clean-up crew come in. The tables all have to be cleaned off, tablecloths and chairs wiped down, Sunday School rooms put back into order and the walls put back up. The large roasters and cook pots are washed and put away until the next supper. The kitchen cleaned and floors washed and vacuumed.

As you can see, there is a lot of work involved in having a supper, but it is a lot of fun and fellowship, too. Please consider where you can be of service and join us.
