Do you wonder why there is a clock with no hands? Do you know what time it is? None of us really knows what time it is. We know that Advent begins this year on December 1 at midnight. Here is a version of Psalm 23 from Japan, as reprinted in Mother Teresa, Life in the Spirit: Reflections, Meditations, Prayers, ed. Kathryn Spink (San Francisco, Harper & Row, 1983), 76-77.

Keep this close at hand and read it each day of Advent. It will be a reminder to slow down and live prayerfully as you prepare for Jesus' arrival instead of preparing for the arrival of Santa.

The Lord is my pace setter . . . I shall not rush

He makes me stop for quiet intervals

He provides me with images of stillness which restore my serenity

He leads me in the way of efficiency through calmness of mind and his guidance is peace Even though I have a great many things to accomplish each day, I will not fret, for his presence is here

His timelessness, his all importance will keep me in balance

He prepares refreshment and renewal in the midst of my activity by anointing my mind with his oils of tranquility

My cup of joyous energy overflows

Truly harmony and effectiveness shall be the fruits of my hours for I shall walk in the Pace of my Lord and dwell in his house for ever.

As we go through this busy time – take time to pray and thank God for life, love, family, friends, and Emmanuel.

Blessings during this Advent season culminating in a very blessed Christmas!

# Thank You



# FAITH, REFLECTION, OUTREACH, GROWTH

Thanks to everyone who participated and gave their time and talent to renewing our Vision and Mission Statements. Our Vision Statement is *"Faith, Reflection, Outreach, Growth"*. Expanding on those words, we worked out a Mission Statement for us to follow in order to fulfill the Vision.

"Empowered by our faith in Jesus Christ, the mission of Emmanuel United Church of Christ is to use the power of reflective prayer to reach out and serve those in spiritiual and physicial need and to spread the good news in our community in order to grow our family of God."

We also discussed concrete ways to put the Mission Statement into action. Ideas for outreach included post cards, handing out brochures and/or magnets with our name and worship times, and planning community events, to name a few. (Like Re-Creation, Men-in-Harmony, etc., and a family day geared toward families with kids) All these plans, however, are dependent upon our own faith and reflecting on our own role in Christ's church, both individually and as the body of Christ as outlined in the first phrase: "Empowered by our faith in Jesus Christ..." Faith in Christ is our power source, prayer will guide us, outreach and service will define us, growth will be the result.

### PNEC Disaster Response Ministry Message from Linda Lenhart:

"Typhoon Haiyan has killed as many as 10,000 people in the Philippines, with the devastation it caused being described as "absolute bedlam," the BBC reported. Nearly 4.5 million persons have been affected by the storm. The United Church of Christ today issued an appeal to church members and friends for \$250,000 to support Typhoon Haiyan response efforts"

"On Sunday November 17, 2013 a large portion of the Great Lakes and Midwest United States experienced several types of severe weather. Many locations reported damaging winds, hail and up to 68 tornadoes. UCC Disaster Ministries staff is in contact with impacted UCC Conference Ministers and Conference Disaster Coordinators to assess damage and offer support from ne Great Hour of Sharing."
